WALL AND FLOOR TILING

Graduates will achieve qualifications for skilled jobs needed throughout the Pacific.

Certificate III level training is available in:

- automotive trades
- construction & electrical trades and
- manufacturing

Eligibility:

Training programs in Wall and Floor Tiling are focused on New Industry Entrants and Existing Workers currently employed in industry. New Industry Entrants programs focus on graduates of Technical Vocational Education & Training (TVET).

Training programs in Wall and Floor Tiling offered through the APTC are designed to recognise skills already held and enhance the skills of Pacific Islanders to international standards

Training provided:

Graduates from the Australia-Pacific Technical College (ACEM), will receive an internationally recognized Australian Qualifications Framework Certificate level III course award.

Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling BCG31303

The Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling develops the skills needed to work as a competent and qualified tradesman working with a variety of materials and surfaces.

Brief description of course and work roles:

Wall and floor tilers generally fix wall and floor tiles, carry out mosaic and decorative tiling to flat, vertical, horizontal and curved surfaces also. Tilers lay ceramic, clay, slate, marble, glass and other types of tiles on external and internal walls and floors to create protective and decorative finishes.

Much of the work takes place on new buildings, including:

- houses; kitchens, floor and designated wet areas, including waterproofing
- shops and offices, including commercial kitchens
- industrial applications eg. factories
- swimming pools; both domestic and public, and
- tilers also carry out renovations on existing buildings.

There is significant demand across the Pacific for highly skilled tilers working in the construction industry associated with four and five star resort developments, as well as commercial office complexes and residential developments.



The course can be customised to address specific skill requirements of the domestic and commercial and industrial sectors of the industry

Course commencement dates:

Training programs are flexible and currently start monthly. Please contact your local APTC office for actual start dates.

Training is offered in the following locations:

Course content includes the following skills:

- Follow OH&S policies and procedures
- Work effectively in the General Construction Industry
- Plan and organise work
- Conduct workplace communication
- Carry out measurements and calculations
- Read and interpret plans and specifications
- Apply basic levelling procedures
- Carry out concreting to simple forms
- Handle wall and floor tiling materials
- Use wall and floor tiling tools and equipment
- Prepare surfaces for tiling application
- Fix floor tiles
- Fix wall tiles
- Repair wall and floor tiles
- Carry out decorative tiling
- Carry out mosaic tiling
- Tile curved surfaces
- Tile domestic pools and spas
- Apply waterproofing process to internal wet areas
- Use solid plastering tools and equipment

Entry requirements:

This program is specifically designed for those who have current industry experience or have graduated from a local training program. Selection will be based on industry experience, relevant previous education and an interview with APTC staff. Applicants will need to complete a

Literacy and Numeracy Assessment as part of the selection procedure as well as a Skills Assessment Program, which will help APTC staff determine your level within the Australian qualification system.

Duration

Course duration will depend on the course requirements and current skills the applicant possesses, however as a guide all courses are part time and may take up to two years to complete. There are flexible entry and exit times for all programs.

Some students will be exempt from certain course elements if they have relevant work experience or qualifications.
