6.1 Fiji

Students

Student Activities

The student representatives have been appointed and encouraged to develop 'groups of interest'. It is anticipated that this strategy will support positive approaches to how students spend their leisure time. Each group has been allocated a small budget for the purchase of equipment to be used for these activities. To date interests have been varied and a fishing club, gardening group, craft group and a sports group have been established.

Student Environmental Officers

Another initiative currently underway is the appointment of a designated Student Environmental Officer for each course group studying at the Namaka campus. Their role is to monitor the recycling process and allocate associated responsibilities to classmates. Each classroom has been supplied with recycling bins.

The students have embraced the concept of recycling and they can often be heard reminding each other when items are placed in the wrong bin. FNU are now joining with APTC to support this recycling initiative.

Education and Training Delivery

Women in Non-Traditional Trades

APTC encourages gender equity within its programs. Two recent examples are the two women currently participating in the Certificate II in Construction (Samoa Cyclone Rebuild) program and one new industry entrant in the Certificate III automotive program. The automotive student is undertaking work placement with Carpenters Motors and is the first female student to gain a work placement with Carpenters Motors in Suva.

Work Placements

All Certificate III in Hospitality (Commercial Cookery) students are currently participating in work placement one day per week at the Sheraton Denarau. Whilst at the Sheraton students have the opportunity to work in a minimum of three different food outlets. Each outlet has a unique menu and service style. These placements provide students with the opportunity to develop valuable workplace skills which contribute to them being work ready on graduation.

The Certificate III in Children's Services students also recently commenced work placements. They are working in a range of pre-schools, both government and private and will continue work placement until the end of their course.

HR, Staffing, Administration, Educational Professional Support

Australian Industry Exposure for Tutors

Certificate III in Mechanical Trade (Diesel Fitting) tutors undertook a specialist training program with MTU Detroit Diesel in Brisbane. Following this workshop they participated in work placement to gain valuable industry experience.

More recently Fitting and Machining trainer and tutor undertook industry release, visiting the Queensland Sugar Industry and spending time in Brisbane at Queensland TAFE's Skills Tech Australia undertaking moderation and validation of the Fiji program delivery. They then visited the sugar industry mills in Mackay to experience current mill operations. This exposure provided valuable skill and knowledge development which will be of great benefit when working with personnel from the Fiji Sugar industry.

STT Moderation Workshop

The School of Trades and Technology (STT) Moderation and Validation Workshop was hosted in Suva in September 2013. The conference brought together the Academic Manager, Manager SCIT Building Excellence in Teaching, APTC trainers, tutors and other relevant staff from all campus locations to undertake moderation and validation activities.

Stakeholder Engagement: Australian Aid, Industry and Community

Up-Skilling Program for Early Childhood Educators

APTC and FNU have designed and are co-delivering an up-skilling program for current teachers who host both APTC and FNU students for work placement. The teachers will undertake nine weeks of training in guiding children's behaviour and implementing play based learning. This activity has been beneficial to individual teachers but will also enable them to more actively support students when they are on work placement.

Industry Morning Tea

Over thirty teachers from the pre-school sector recently joined the team at the Namaka campus for morning tea, and discussed work placement processes and opportunities for improvement. This event also provided an opportunity for the Certificate III in Children's Services students to develop networks within the sector.

Alumni Activities

Past student Nau Dakuiliga has been competing at an international level in triathlons. At the recent third Pacific Islands Triathlon and Cycling Championship held in PNG, Nau competed against athletes from Guam, PNG, Australia and the Solomon Islands. Nau came fourth in the Sprint Triathlon and second in the cycling race, winning a silver medal.

Reshad Shah who studied cookery in 2010 at the Namaka campus has started his own catering business and will soon become the proprietor of his own restaurant. He intends to focus on healthy eating options and is keen to support current APTC students to make healthier food choices.

Business Development: FFS Activity, New Partnerships

Partnerships with training organisation are critical for the longer term sustainability of the APTC. Partnerships provide strong capacity and capability opportunities for the local TVET Institutions and support strong sustainability outcomes for APTC with higher levels of recognition being provided and a resultant reduction in delivery time for APTC programs.

APTC – VTC Partnership Launch

On Wednesday 14 August 2013 the partnership between the Vivekananda Technical Centre (VTC) and the APTC was launched. This partnership will deliver technical and vocational skills training and qualifications for VTC trainers and students. The APTC – VTC Agreement will provide capacity and capability development through the training of VTC teaching staff in delivery methods and the development of recognition pathways from the curriculum of VTC to AQF Certificate II level qualifications in the Certificate III in Automotive Mechanical Technology and Cookery. The partnership will also support the development of educational resources.

The main characteristics of the partnership are:

- Increasing and enhancing training options for students
- Development and implementation of a TVET Pathway Pilot program
- Increasing the capacity of the VTC to deliver recognised training programs
- The professional development for VTC teaching staff

Tuition Fee Training

Eight kitchen staff from the Hilton are currently enrolled in a Certificate III in Patisserie bridging course with APTC.

Students

Course applications have been very strong with a total of 163 course applications being processed during this quarter.

MESC Part-time Fee Paying Disability Program

Twenty students employed by the Ministry of Education Sports and Culture commenced training in September 2013 and will complete their part-time studies in September 2014.

September Graduation

At this graduation there were seventy graduates - sixty-eight from Samoa and two Fijians now living and working in Samoa.

Gym

To support an expansion of activities for students the campus has negotiated with the National University of Samoa a competitive rate for gym sessions for students. Many students are enjoying these sessions and make good use of the access.

Computer classes

Computer skills have been identified and critical for students to operate effectively in today's business environment. To support the development of these skills classes are held every Saturday and Wednesday evening. These classes provide training and support in computing skills for beginners through to advanced. The classes are also an opportunity for students to use email to communicate with their families and to access computers to complete assignments.

Education and Training Delivery

Refrigeration and Air Conditioning

- Current students have participated in the Samoa HPMP training
- Teaching team have worked with Samoan technicians to test for trade licenses

Fabrication/Welding

Two fabrication students provided a strong contribution to the hospital maintenance team while on work placement. Their high performance has resulted in a promise of employment at the national hospital should they wish to seek employment with them. Host employers generally have commented positively regarding the performance of work placement students.

Plumbing

The current Certificate III in Plumbing class is a very good example of APTCs capacity building activities for local institutions. The current group is comprised of:

- Fourteen lecturers/teachers from NUS, funded from the APTC/NUS shared capacity building agreement
- Four Fee-For-Service students
- One APTC tutor

They have been involved with a number of activities providing repairs to the APTC building and local disability accommodation.

Tourism

Students and staff have been very active in a range of tourism events and activities. This provides excellent work placement opportunities as well as building industry relationships:

- Students had the opportunity to inspected two cruise ships (Cunard's QUEEN VICTORIA and Holland America's OOSTERDAM)
- Students researched and devised a full day sight-seeing tour (the Fun Day Out) of Upolu for fellow students
- Participated as volunteers in Kayak4Youth celebratory function at Sinalei Resort
- Students conducted half day sightseeing (HDSS) tours for M & A Travel's clients/passengers in Upolu
- Students attended pre-briefing and participated as volunteers in the inaugural Samoan Half Iron Man Competition

HR, Staffing, Administration, Educational Professional Support

Current staff

APTC Samoa now employs thirty staff at its campus at NUS. Eighteen of these are Samoans including ten tutors working alongside ex-pat trainers as part of the APTC nationalisation strategy.

Stakeholder Engagement: Australian Aid, Industry and Community

Cyclone recovery programs

In response to the destruction by Cyclone Evan and with additional special funding from Australian Aid APTC has commenced two courses that are providing skill enhancement and recovery. They are: a hospitality course customised for twenty Samoan students who are employees at accommodation facilities that suffered extremely severe damage during Cyclone Evan. These students are being trained in food and beverage, cookery, housekeeping and tourism units so they can contribute to all facets of the regrowth of the businesses. They will finish their course in December. This program has included on site work experience at Tanoa Tusitala Resort.

This course will be offered again in January 2014 instead of the usual APTC Hospitality (Food and Beverage) course due to the industry demand for this modified version.

The second response program is in construction and addresses the housing needs of three cyclone devastated villages on the south west of Upolu. This program is partly funded under additional Australian Aid funding for cyclone recovery. There are fifteen students undertaking the course – thirteen males and two females.

Alumni Activities

One of APTCs Cookery graduates who studied in Samoa was awarded an NZAID scholarship to study the Diploma of Hospitality Management in Auckland. On return to Samoa, he successfully applied for a scholarship to China, where he is now completing a Masters in Food Technology.

Four Certificate III in Carpentry and one plumbing graduates are now building inspectors at the Ministry of Works Samoa, another is now a Senior Properties Officer for the Samoa Housing Corporation and one has been appointed as the Foreman/Supervisor of the new hockey stadium Samoa, this stadium will be the largest building in Samoa.

A graduate of the disability program has successfully applied for a three year scholarship with the Cambodia Trust to study the Advanced Diploma in Orthotics/Prosthetics. He will return and work for the Ministry of Health. Another graduate from the disabilities program will soon commence further study in Penang, Malaysia in the operation of new screen reading software and related ICT programs. Two other graduates from this program have secured employment with HomeCare in New Zealand.

Steve Johnston was Chief Judge for the NZ - Samoa friendship week Restaurant Challenge. APTC also presented a prize at this important industry event. The Country Manager was a member of the Samoa Tourism Development Plan – Reference Group in August. The country manager participated in the inaugural Samoa National Building Code Committee meeting which included CEO's of major government departments and representatives of all building and engineering industry groups.

Students

The student orientation in July incorporated some new topics including Occupational Health and Safety (including health and hygiene) and Competency Based Training. Semester 1, 2014 orientation will be extended to two full days and accommodate an expanded program of activities.

Work placements continue to be a major part of the overall campus training strategy. Formal placements are underway for courses in Youth Work, Children's Services, Tourism and Hospitality. On the job activities have also been identified for Certificate III in Carpentry courses.

Round Island Tour

This successful mid-semester break activity initially planned primarily for international students proved to be a hit with local students who had never been around Efate. Students were all actively involved in the day's activities.

Calendar of Events

A calendar is being developed by the Student Services Officer and the Operations Supervisor, and will showcase all student activities in the coming year – from activities such as clean up the world day, to outdoor movie night information, as well as the usual Thursday sports afternoon.

ANZ Money Minded program

This is a full one day workshop on how to budget, how to save, bank accounts, the importance of planning for the future, making money last until next payday, prioritising, budgeting and assertiveness, how to say no. This is a free service offered by the ANZ and is open to all students. This program also supports the APTC to Work delivery.

Education and Training Delivery

Many opportunities exist in the community for students to gain experience. Students have served canapés and cocktails at the Australian High Commissioner's residence, drinks and BBQ at Banjo's, the AHC social group. Upcoming events include the Pro Medical (Ambulance service) Charity Dinner, the Vanuatu Golf Open, the Salon Culinaire Service Person of the Year, and the Vanuatu International Barista Competition. The student's reputation for providing excellent service and APTC's reputation for outstanding training is recognised and valued throughout the community.

The Certificate III in Community Services Work placement program continues to grow with students now placed in a range of settings such as VIT Youth Workers in School Pilot, Transparency International, and Save the Children.

LLN is a high priority

A range of LLN activities are underway or being investigated at present throughout Vanuatu:

- APTC Learning Support Facilitator recruitment is underway. In Vanuatu this position will incorporate a pilot program in provincial outreach. The terms of reference for the pilot are currently being developed.
- Save the Children Youth Out of School Literacy Program. A concept paper is being developed for funding through NZAID to develop a peer mentoring program incorporating senior school students, with a view to provide pathways back to the school sector through organisations such as rural training centres and VIT.
- NZAid funded National Workplace Strategy Advisor for Literacy and Numeracy has been in contact with the APTC Co-ordinator for LLN to gain an understanding of the APTC LLN approach. This strategy aims to provide a base for implementation of a pilot TVET program focused on functional literacy in the provinces.

Stakeholder Engagement: Australian Aid, Industry and Community

Meetings were held with TVET Sector Strengthening Program Team Leader and the Australian Aid TVET Adviser regarding LLN issues in the provinces and how APTC might support LLN initiatives.

Australian Aid Team Leader Meeting

Quarterly meetings are held with the Counsellor Australian Aid Port Vila. The purpose of the meetings is to keep all programs informed of Australian Aid programs and their project goals. The focus of this meeting was marketing and communications, and the need for impact stories. Program leaders were asked to consider program milestones, anniversaries and options for radio programs. The meeting was attended by the APTC Country Manager, Pacific Media Association, Wan Smol Bag, Vanuatu Land Program, Law and Justice Program, Australian Youth Ambassadors and Red Cross Volunteers and adviser to Auditor General.

There was a special introduction to new program advisers from Vanuatu Education Sector Program, Phase II of Rural Road Program, and Phase III of the TVET Program. The next meeting is to focus on the Women in the Pacific Program and demand driven development.

The country manager has also met with the first Secretary NZAID. This meeting has been a catalyst for ongoing meetings regarding tourism activities. Tourism development is currently a key focus area NZAid as well as training for the tourism industry. NZAid has also launched the Port Vila Seafront improvement project. This is a major infrastructure development that will support the tourism sector.

Discussions were held with Vanuatu Tourism Adviser, who is currently scoping out the development of an HRD plan for the tourism sector. APTC has scope to be a major provider of high level tourism training with Vanuatu.

A major initiative for NZAid is the Tourism Ambassador Program. APTC students and trainers attended the launch of this program which is designed to provide training to hundreds of taxi drivers, bus drivers and entry level hotel employees such as house keepers. The Vanuatu National Training Council is developing training packages, adopting and adapting a combination of NZ and Australian standards. This work will take some time to complete but is expected to support improved skills in the tourism area.

Alumni Activities

The next graduation for Vanuatu will be held on 20 November 2013.

Facilities, ICT, Assets: Accommodation, Security Equipment and Buildings

The computer laboratory has been upgraded with 24 operational computers. The computer laboratory is open for student use every Tuesday evening and Saturday morning.

Student laptops are now available for student loans and for use in classrooms. The availability of laptops was a great support for the use of the APTC toolbox resources in the recent delivery of the Certificate IV in TAE.

On advice from Australian Aid Port Vila post, old computers have been donated to the Vanuatu Institute of Teacher Education and Vila North School (VNS). VNS is a kindergarten to year twelve school and has no computers.

Refurbishment activities for the Vanuatu campus are underway. New additions to the foyer will support potential applicants with the inclusion of assessment cubicles; a kitchenette in the student break out area will improve student amenities; and the toilets are also being upgrade.

Business Development: FFS Activity, New Partnerships

FFS and Fee paying programs at Port Vila are being well received and a number of programs are underway.

Student studying Certificate IV in Youth Work, Diploma of Children's Services and Diploma of Community Services at APTC have joined with Save the Children Vanuatu in advocating for Child Protection by organising the first APTC Child Protection Student Symposium. This three day workshop will provide students with up to date knowledge and skills in each of their respective community sectors in the area of Child Protection.

The program will be delivered by Save the Children Vanuatu, improving and cementing the partnership that has developed between this organisation and APTC. Guest presentations from Ministry of Justice and Community Services, State Law Office, Family Protection Unit and Vanuatu Women's Centre will provide participants with a current understanding of the issues in the area of child protection. The symposium will culminate in the development of Child Protection policies in a range of organisations that the students represent.

Marketing and Promotions: Media Events, Community

Millennium Cave School Project

This story is the first of a series of stories which will be written to highlight the impact of studying at APTC. This story will interview operators of the Millennium Cave adventure tours and others involved in the project. The operators are graduates of the APTC tourism program and they have used these skills to develop a

highly successful business which supports a number of community initiatives. This story has will appear in the October 2013 edition of Australian Aid Focus Magazine.

Tourism Students Parade

A street parade was held to launch the Tourism Ambassadors program. APTC tourism students proudly participated in the march alongside our partner, Vanuatu Institute of Technology students to showcase training opportunities in the tourism sector.
